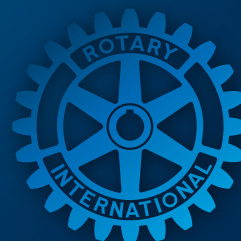

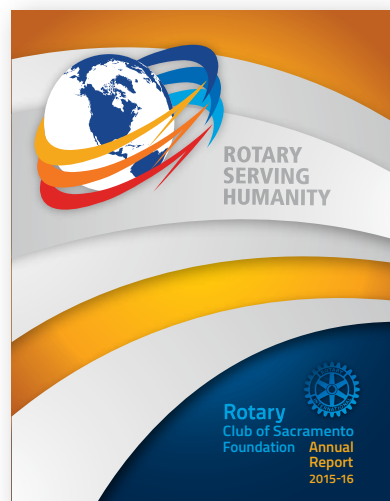

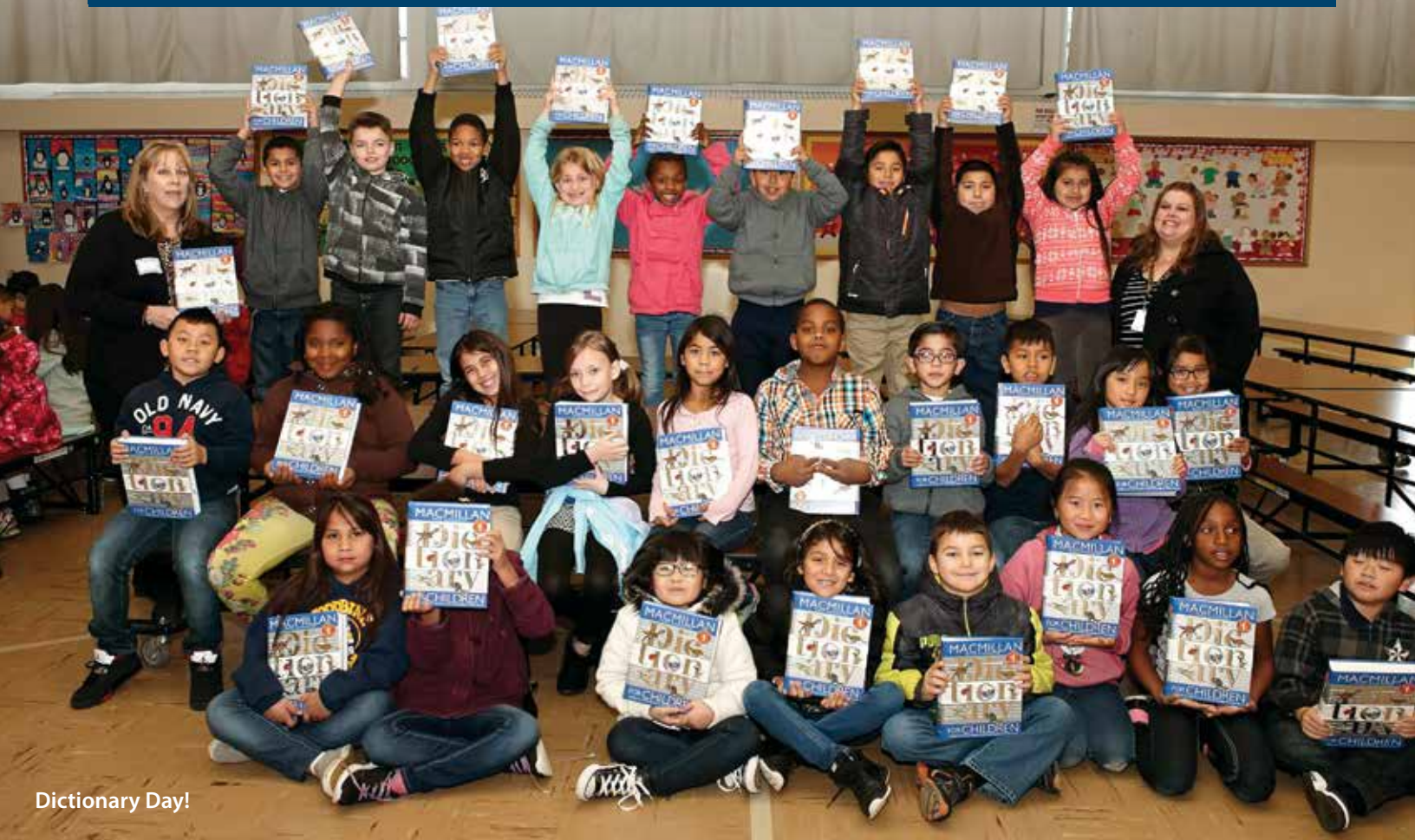

The Sacramento Century and Oktoberfest on October 10, 2015, was a great achievement and promises to keep growing in contributions, community support, and Rotary's visibility throughout the Sacramento Region.

Our goal in starting this event in 2014 was to make it an annual ride to engage the community in helping us raise funds to benefit a different non-profit each year.

This year, 1500 registered riders and almost 350 volunteers supported our event, which raised **\$27,119** from the generous contributions of our club members and from numerous outside sources.



Our beneficiary this year was **Team Red, White & Blue**, an organization that enriches the lives of America's veterans returning

from deployment by connecting them to their community through physical and social activity.

Four fun and flat bike rides with 100, 65, 30 and 20 mile route options through the scenic Sacramento River Delta wine region offered "something for everyone," and included rest stops with food and drinks and SAG vehicles with supplies and gear.

The rides started and finished on Capitol Mall where cyclists and friends enjoyed a post-ride Oktoberfest with live music by Mumbo Gumbo, Playback, and City of Trees Brass Band, along with 10 food trucks, local wine and beer vendors, and a kid-friendly play zone.

Sacramento Rotary Club's Pony Express Marathon

The inaugural Pony Express Marathon, the first of its kind for the Rotary Club of Sacramento, raised nearly **\$75,000** for our beneficiaries, including **Alpha K9**, a non-profit dedicated to providing our disabled veterans with service dogs at no cost.

The event on May 1, 2016, offered something for everyone: a full marathon, half marathon, marathon relay, 5K run and 5K pony run. Courses ran from the Capitol Mall to the Delta, and the USATF-certified full and half marathons enabled runners to qualify for other races, including the Boston Marathon.

Participants were able to see much of the best of Sacramento as they ran through Old Town and Land Park, past the Pony Express monument and Raley Field, over the Tower Bridge and along the river. A post-race Finish Line Festival on Capitol Mall completed the enjoyment.

The event was truly a community effort, involving donations and support from nearly 100 agencies, businesses and individuals. The Rotary Club of Sacramento would like to thank all those who made it possible, including our hundreds of volunteers, our sister Rotary Clubs, our training partner Runnin' for Rhett, and especially our event co-chairs: Bob Daly and Gabriel Gendron. Rotarians Mentor At-Risk Students Through YIP

The Youth Incentive Program (YIP) matches at-risk 7th grade students with a Rotary Club mentor who makes a 5-year commitment to help that student establish and meet academic, athletic, social and self-esteem goals – and develop into a productive and confident young adult. YIP students are introduced to cultural events, possible career paths, and often attend Rotary's RYLA and REGL Leadership Camps.

Students who complete YIP and graduate high school are eligible to receive a \$10,000 Rotary scholarship toward continued education. To date, YIP has awarded scholarships totaling **\$139,128**.

Currently, 21 local students are being mentored by Rotarians or their spouses. Every YIP student has graduated high school and six have completed college.

Sacramento Rotary Helps Deliver Clean Water Across the Globe

ETHIOPIA

In 2015, our club, along with several others and Rotary International, partnered with World Vision in an enormous clean water project in Ethiopia.

Through our team effort, clean water is now being delivered to thousands of Ethiopian villagers, eliminating the arduous task of walking miles to collect unsanitary water.



This task had been the job of the young women and girls of the villages who often had to walk many miles daily and encountered many dangers.

With clean, safe water being delivered to the villages, many of these girls will now be able to attend school – for the first time.



BRAZIL

In the favelas, slums within urban areas of Brazil, life is a series of daily challenges – one of which is clean water.

During the Rotary International meeting in Sao Paulo, we participated with our district in providing several hundred water filters to the residents of the favelas.

It was an inspiring event for all Rotarians who took part and was gratefully appreciated by the locals.

CAMBODIA

As many of our club members know, we have been supporting the efforts of Journeys Within Our Community (JWOC) located in Siem Reap, Cambodia.

Our club has been involved in ongoing projects to deliver clean water to local villages and schools.

In addition, we have also been supporting a comprehensive literacy program that has resulted in a state-of-the-art computer lab.



In April, we enjoyed a special treat when Kanha Reath, a graduate student of JWOC, spoke to our club.

It was heart-warming to hear an account of her life in Cambodia and the wonderful future she has been afforded through the generosity of Rotary and others.

NAMED FUNDS: SCHOLARSHIPS AND GRANTS

Rotary scholarships totaling \$16,000 were given from the Named Funds below during the 2015-16 Rotary year.

Recipients were eight high school seniors from C.K. McClatchy, Sacramento, Rio Americano and Christian Brothers who demonstrated superior scholastic aptitude, vocational skills, leadership, community involvement, and financial need.

Scholarships are awarded for high school tuition or to graduating seniors for full-time undergraduate enrollment at an accredited four-year college. Fields of study that will benefit the future of the community and foster the principles of Rotary are encouraged.

Additionally, three Rotary grants totaling \$3,219 from Named Funds below were awarded to community organizations designated by the donors to help support their humanitarian purposes in the region.

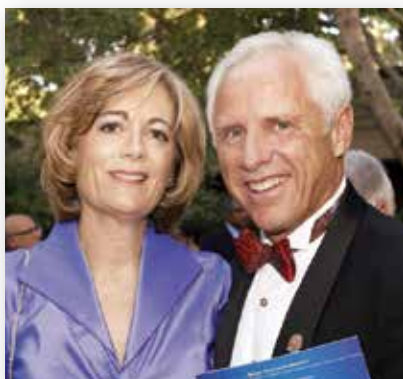

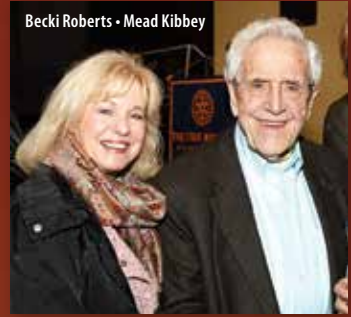

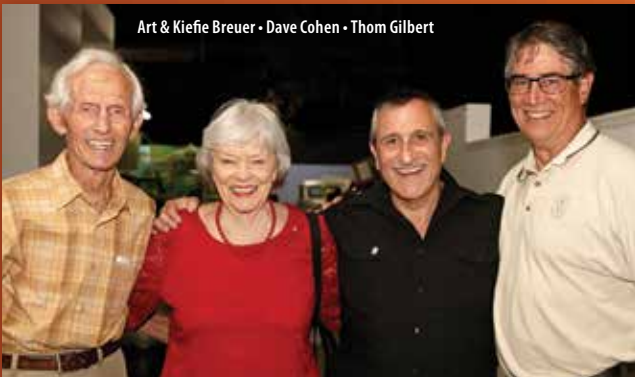
