The International Service
Committee in partnership with several NGOs participated in bringing clean healthy water to 80,000 villagers in Ethiopia and Honduras.

"Travel limitations have not limited and do not prevent the ISC from forming relationships and partnerships worldwide. We are working closely with USAID and Rotary International. USAID is the largest U.S. government agency providing aid to foreign countries. USAID has called upon Rotary to provide "boots on the ground" experience throughout the world to assist in implementing this major WASH (water, sanitation and hygiene) project in up to three countries in Africa. Our club's goal is to collaborate and provide clean water, enhanced hygiene and reliable sanitation to 1 million people around the world."
