Over 1100 registered riders started and finished on Capitol Mall and rode through the Sacramento River Delta wine region. They enjoyed sunny skies, perfect fall weather, rest stops at a pumpkin patch, the Friends of the 1883 Clarksburg Schoolhouse Restoration site and lunch in Isleton. The ride is for every one of any age and ability with 4 routes of 20/36/63/100 miles and an elevation of 960 feet.

Riders and guests relaxed at the post ride festival on Capital Mall with live music, food trucks and beer and wine vendors. This year's event raised over \$92,500 to benefit the Crisis Nursery."
